


Demographics & Program Choice







Comments on your current team/program?

1. Communication from coaching staff to parents and players sub par

- 2. No one cares about AA. The AAA teams are substantially chosen well in advance of evaluations. Lots of instances of late releases from AAA so players can't go elsewhere. Affiliation is only to cover injury and never for development. AA is still competitive and fun though but we need to stop pretending it's anything other than money maker for AAA and provides injury coverage. I think this is fine but should be more transparent.
- 3. Very happy so far. Not much to complain about.
- 4. Okotoks lost 8 potential players to the glaciers this season (a small city draw zone really suffers from this) - some due to the association initially making a poor coach choice - who then left, for the glaciers fsl. Both returning goalie left for boys - the parents thought the team would be terrible and their kids deserved to play 'better hockey''. Current coach is great but had no time to recruit players. We had very few try out due to cost and people going to FSL. One Current assistant coach is always yelling at the refs, he is also a ref and should know better as most of our refs are young. He is giving constant feedback to the kids and the refs mostly corrective, but it's making a very intense vibe on the bench - not what mediocre team of young girls needs. Pre-season. Association did not help find a coach when the first one guit- a couple of us parents did that. Association did not announce our current female coach or introduce her.. she has a great resume. U13 girls do not matter to this association. There was no effort to try keep players from leaving for glaciers & they let a parent meeting get out of hand - arrogant board members vs arrogant parents. The south division is very hard - Calgary has 3 very strong teams, Airdrie is strong. We will be lucky if we win any division games this year. The kids efforts are starting to show that they are defeated before the game starts. Goalies are getting 40-50 shots per game. Only 2 goalies tried out for this team. Also about sure how we have such a high budget with so little travel. Now rumor is Strathmore has put in for AA status. This will further dilute our pool of girls to choose from and I'm sure that FSL will try expand as well. Not sure how it will all play out next season if we don't get some of the FSL girls back.
- 5. Compared to HSL there is more games per month which equates to more travel less practice time and less off ice development which still costs more compared to HSL
- 6. We can still cut back on a few unnecessary expenses.
- 7. OOAA is run by a rich guy who thinks everyone else is rich. Therefore OOAA programs cost more than other but here is not more opportunities or exposure.
- 8. Current coaching staff is fantastic. Evaluations for AA were great and thats 100% reflective of the coaches. AAA evaluations were a complete joke, again 100% reflective of the coach. Reffing is wholly inconsistent and, at times, god awful.
- 9. We have enjoyed our time so far on the team and apart of the association. I think showcase weekends will help limit travel for teams especially in the winter months and allow for more exposure.
- 10. We are very happy with the commitment of the coaching staff and team and families. Excellent group of people with like minded goals for the kids
- 11. Team is lacking depth due to players leaving for hsl/phl programs.
- 12. Our program lost a handful of Eligble players to alternative leagues therefore our team Isn't as strong as some of the others.
- 13. So far so good
- 14. Would not like to see AAA team in Okotoks, too many elite teams (Method, AA) for small town. Only the top tier team does well, all of the remaining players spread thinly and AA, and tiered teams are all at the bottom of their leagues.
- 15. Some of our practices are very late for the age group or too early. Draw zone teams can not practice at 6:30 am in the morning. These players will not make it to school on time. They also can not practice till 9:15 pm at night. Our players will not get home until 11:00 pm. I do think that other associations should help provide ice for the draw zone teams for practice. It should not be the burden of one association to provide all the ice for practice. For example Strathmore provide 2 practices per month and/or High River.
- 16. Hockey has become far to expensive and thus not inclusive.
- 17. The coaches this year are great compared to U15AA
- 18. Female programs don't promote females to stay in the female stream. The league has benefited with Calgary teams, but lost girls to other leagues due to practice times, and travel for practices
- 19. I think that showcases should take place more often. Driving to Lloydminster and Grand Prairie for League games is crazy at this age. I think they should be playing 4-5 games a weekend in a showcase setting. These could take place in Edmonton, red deer, Calgary and Lethbridge. This would save a lot on travel
- 20. Good program and continues to make strides.
- 21. Our officials have arranged from 2-4 people at a game. A 2 ref system is an issue at the AAA level.

- 22. Second year players should be more accepting of first year players. First year players are only members of the team because they have the skill level to be there and to make the team that much better.
- 23. Okotoks U18AAA daytime programming is a tremendous development model for both on and off ice development. Academic support is a massive value add




